General Attendee Info

Postponement of Play

The USGA will have meteorology staff on-site monitoring the possibility of dangerous or inclement weather. If hazardous weather conditions are approaching, special "weather alert" signs will be displayed on leaderboards and video boards around the course. When the sign appears, fans are advised to take immediate precautions (including clearing grandstands) PRIOR to play being suspended. In the event of a weather alert, please avoid open areas, isolated trees, golf carts and wire fences.

If play is suspended, indicated by one prolonged air-horn blast, it means that dangerous weather is in the vicinity. In the event of a suspension of play, grandstands will be cleared immediately. Play will resume as soon as conditions allow. Resumption of play occurs with two short blasts of an air horn, repeated once.

Fan Guide

The Fan Guide will be a valuable resource for information as you and your guests prepare to attend the championship. The Fan Guide contains general parking and transportation information, a schedule of events, a detailed course map, as well as other important championship information.

The Fan Guide will be available on the U.S. Open website as the championship draws near. You will be able to provide this information to your guests, so they can become acclimated with the course layout, the location of your hospitality area, and championship policies prior to their arrival.

Pairing Sheets

Pairing sheets provide the starting hole number and tee time for each group of golfers during the championship rounds (Thursday – Sunday), as well as a detailed map of the course. Pairing Sheets will be available on the U.S. Open website and on the U.S. Open mobile app as soon as they are released.

Note: Players determine their own pairings and tee times during the practice rounds (Monday-Wednesday). The practice round pairings and times will be communicated via the Practice Round Boards located throughout the course as well as on the U.S. Open mobile app.

Grandstands

Grandstand seating will be located at strategic viewing areas throughout the course and available to all fans on a first-come, first-served basis. Access to grandstands will be closed once each specific grandstand reaches capacity.

Safety & Etiquette

Below is a list of safety and etiquette guidelines developed by the USGA. We encourage you to share this list with your guests.

- Please wear appropriate footwear suitable for substantial walking on hills, dirt paths and other uneven surfaces.
- Please stay behind gallery ropes and always follow directions of championship marshals.
- Do not cross fairways except at designated crosswalk areas.
- Be considerate of others and kneel or sit if you are in the front row of the gallery.
- Stay guiet and stand still when players are about to hit or when instructed by marshals.
- Drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.
- To ensure your safety at all times, walk carefully and never run.
- The following acts are considered a breach of etiquette and could result in the loss of ticket privileges and/or expulsion from the championship grounds:
- Making rude, vulgar, or other inappropriate comments or gestures. Verbal or physical harassment of players, volunteers, officials, or fans.
- Distracting a player or any disruption of play.
- Behavior that is unruly, disruptive, unsafe, or illegal in nature.

Failing to follow the instructions of a U.S. Open or MSG Promotions staff member, championship official, volunteer or security personnel.

Prohibited Items

The USGA prohibits fans from bringing certain items to the U.S. Open. A complete list of prohibited items will be available on the U.S. Open website and listed in the Digital Fan Guide.

Everyone attending the U.S. Open will be subject to a security screening prior to entering the championship grounds and will not be allowed to bring any of the items listed below.

To expedite admission into the championship, it is recommended that all prohibited items are either left at home or safely stored in your vehicle prior to arriving at the championship.

LIST OF PROHIBITED ITEMS

- No Weapons (regardless of permit, including but not limited to firearms or knives)
- No Explosives and/or Fireworks of any kind
- No Tablets and/or Computers (mobile devices smaller than 7" are permitted, subject to mobile device policy)
- No Drones
- No Selfie Sticks
- No Cameras (point and shoot, film, or DSLR) or Video Cameras (other than Monday through Wednesday for personal use only)
- No Noise-Producing Devices (including portable speakers)
- No Backpacks, Briefcases and/or Bags larger than 6" W x 6" H x 6" D in their natural state Note: Transparent/clear plastic hand and shoulder bags no larger than 12" W x 12" H x 6"D are permitted.
- No Signs, Posters, Banners and/or other Sports Paraphernalia or Memorabilia
- No Food and/or Beverages except for medical or infant needs
- Water bottles (32-ounce size or less, no glass) are permitted provided they are empty
- No Glass, Coolers, Aerosol Cans and/or Spray Bottles except for medical or infant needs

Note: Personal-care items (3-ounce size or less) are permitted.

- No Pets (other than service animals as defined by the ADA assisting disabled individuals)
- No Lawn Chairs and/or Oversized Chairs
- No Ladders and/or Step Stools or other similar items
- No Bicycles allowed inside admission areas or on the championship grounds
- No other items or actions deemed unlawful, dangerous, or disruptive by the USGA and/or Championship Security Personnel, in their sole discretion.

Note: The USGA reserves the right to amend the list of Prohibited Items at any time to provide a safe and secure championship.

Cameras & Photography Policy

Stand-alone cameras are permitted on the grounds during practice rounds (Monday through Wednesday) and only for personal photographic use. No photography is permitted in the presence of a player from the time he addresses the ball until the completion of his swing (i.e., when a marshal's arms are raised). Violation of this policy may result in immediate expulsion and loss of ticket privileges for the remainder of the championship.

Stand-alone cameras are prohibited on the grounds during all championship rounds, Thursday, June 16 – Sunday, June 19.

Mobile Device Policy

Fans may carry mobile devices smaller than 7" in length and/or height; however, please make sure all device volume controls are set to "silent" or "vibrate" and flash photography is disabled prior to entering the championship gate. "Fan Zones" will be designated throughout the championship site for fans to place and receive calls. Phone calls must not be received or placed in any area that may disrupt play including grandstands. Photography, video, and audio recording are permitted throughout the course, but content must not be used for commercial purposes and should not disrupt play. Live streaming or shot-by-shot coverage of any player (with or without video) is not permitted at any time throughout championship week. Violation of this policy may result in immediate expulsion and loss of ticket privileges for the remainder of the championship.

Disability Services

The USGA is committed to providing a positive and user-friendly experience for all fans with disabilities and is pleased to provide the following services:

- Accessible parking spaces for all vehicles having appropriate HD/DP license plates or placards will be reserved at all parking locations.
- The Disability Services Committee will be on-site to assist fans with disabilities, with multi- person golf cart transportation to and from Disability Services Headquarters and specific grandstand locations and facilities throughout the golf course via a fixed route with predetermined stops.
- Several motorized scooters will be available at the Mobility Scooter Tent, located in Fan Central for fans with disabilities, on a first-come, first-served basis, compliments of the USGA and Pride Mobility.
- Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf will be available at the Disability Services Headquarters.
- Accessible restrooms will be available at portable restroom locations throughout the championship grounds and at corporate facilities.
- Select concessions, merchandise tents and fan experience areas will be accessible.
